

The owner wanted a designer with the ability and interest in custom interior architectural detailing and was referred to Piana by one of her previous clients. Collectively they established the look he desired. "He has a wonderful design sense; he gravitates towards more contemporary, architectural designs. He explained that he wanted something different than anything he had seen in Naples."

Piana's creative design contributions upon the custom home plan by architect Tracy Boyd which allows for a kind of natural light, angled ceiling, and the use of glass to capture long views from each living space. "This is what can result if you allow your imagination to be opened up and you utilize the full deck," explains Boyd. "This luxury home is built outside of the box, beyond the traditional square idea of what a home should be and how the possibilities."

Softer design elements distinguish the home's scheme, such as an island breakfast table in the living room, brushed stainless steel, glass chafers, and various metals. "We began in the living room, designing a custom local wall with panels of hand-cut colored glass as a backdrop for my client's colorful artwork, and a fully glazed glass," describes Piana. "I created a beautiful wood beam ceiling with metal brackets in the living room and carried it into the kitchen. The use of wood and natural materials is very important in the design. In the hallway, the owner gravitated toward neutrals, textures, grays, and off-whites." The owner's personal art collection adds the color and a special signature to the interior design.
